Is this course for me?

Educators at this level are responsible for designing and implementing curriculum that meets the requirements of an approved learning framework and for maintaining compliance in other areas of service operations. They use specialised knowledge and analyse and apply theoretical concepts to diverse work situations. They may have responsibility for supervision of volunteers or other educators. Early childhood educators work in long day care centres, family day care, preschools or kindergartens.

To achieve this qualification, the individual must have completed a total of least 280 hours of work in a regulated children's education and care service in Australia as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of units of competency. The total number of hours may be applied collectively across all units of competency that include the requirement for workplace hours.

Tuition Fees

Eligibility

- an Australian citizen; or
- a permanent visa holder or holder of visa subclass 309, 444, 785,
 790 or 820:
- a dependent or spouse of the primary holder of a visa subclass 457; o
- a Bridging Visa E holder (subclasses 050 and 051) and you have made a valid application for a visa of subclass 785 or 790.
- visa subclasses 449 and 786, which are currently used for Ukraine and Afghan nationals;
- secondary holders (spouses and dependents) of a Temporary Skill Shortage visa (subclass 482)
- bridging visas A, B, C and E where holders have work rights and have made a valid application for a Permanent Protection Visa (subclass 866).
