You will also learn to deal with and implement support systems and networks, and develop plans which will address your clients immediate and long term needs.

## Entry Requirements

8. CHCMHS007 - Work effectively in trauma informed care
9. CHCCOM001 - Provide first point of contact
10. CHCYTH001 - Engage respectfully with young people
11. CHCDIV002 - Promote Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander cultural safety
12. HLTAID011 - Provide First Aid
