











Welcome to Greenhouse Education and our CHC50113 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care.

Is this course for me?

This course is recommended for you if you have aspirations to move into a senior or management role, where you will be directly responsible for the learning, development and care of children in an Early Education setting.

This Qualification is required if you are seeking a Leadership or Coordinator role, where you will be managing other Early Childhood Educators in a team environment and coordinating an entire Childcare or Outside School Hours Care facility.

Course Overview

This course is designed to graduate Early Childhood Educators who are competent to work in a range of Early Education and Care settings. A key feature of this Diploma course is the emphasis given to connecting theory with practice, so you will be more than proficient in developing Early Childhood Educational Programs, informed by current research, policy and practice within the industry.

Entry Requirements

There are no set pre-requisites for this qualification however; you must show:

- A satisfactory level of language and literacy skills, which will be established at the time of enrolment
- A genuine desire to work in the Early Childhood Education and Care profession
- WA students over 18 must hold a current Working with Children Check Card (we will assist you in applying for one of these if you do not currently hold one).





Career Prospects

Completing this Diploma will open up a vast array of different career opportunities for you within the Early Childhood Industry, as well as possible further education and study opportunities down the track.

Possible job titles relevant to this qualification include:

- Authorised Supervisor
- Educational Leader
- Early Childhood Supervising Officer
- Family Day Care Educator
- Outside School Hours Care Coordinator

Job titles and roles will vary across services.

Course Delivery

- This course runs over a 12-month period.
- Classes are run monthly, one Saturday per month at the Greenhouse Education Training Centre in Clarkson.
- You are also able to attend a Study Workshop, for added learning assistance, every Thursday.
- You will receive experience via hands-on practical application of learning concepts in a safe, simulated workplace environment prior to being assessed in an actual workplace.
- You will be allocated a highly experienced and qualified Trainer / Assessor who, in addition to
 delivering your monthly class and Study Workshop, will also provide support over the phone,
 via email or face-to-face as required.
- During your enrolment process you will be guided through all training and assessments, in
 detail, to ascertain what units are most suitable to your needs and what support strategies are
 necessary to assist you in completing your qualification.
- You will be required to complete a work placement, of a minimum 240-hours, in an allocated professional environment (see below for more details).

Work Placement

Your work placement is designed to practice and develop the skills necessary to become an Early Childhood Educator. These skills will be assessed by your allocated Trainer / Assessor during your minimum 240-hours placement, who will provide support throughout your learning and assessments.

Assessments

All assessments are competency based and you will be assessed against every unit undertaken. All resources required to complete your assessments and qualification will be provided to assist you.

Assessment types may include:

- Practical demonstrations
- Knowledge-based questions
- Portfolio of evidence
- Case studies

- Research projects
- On-the-job assessments
- Oral questioning
- Direct observation

Skills Recognition / Prior Learning Credit Transfer

The process of Skills Recognition (Recognition of Prior Learning and/or Recognition of Current Competencies) allows students with relevant experience the opportunity to gain formal recognition for their competencies (skills and knowledge) gained through life, work and study, regardless of where, when and how these competencies were achieved.

If you feel this is applicable to you, you are responsible for gathering your own evidence to support your application for Skills Recognition and for showing that you have achieved the required competencies to the standard set by the National Industry Standards. If you have completed units of this qualification elsewhere, please provide us with a copy of your certificates for a direct exemption from that unit in this Course.





Course Certification

This Course meets the National Training Requirement for Qualification CHC50113 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care. On completion of all 28 units of competency, you Graduate with a Nationally Recognised Qualification and a Record of Results listing all units of competency completed.

If for whatever reason, you only partially complete your Qualification, you will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for successfully completed units of competency.
